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## CHILD & FAMILY WELL-BEING



### Baby TALK (NE)

Newsletters, group socializations, and home visits for parents with children age 5 and younger.

### Generations Center (NE)

Food, fun, friendship, and support for adults age 55+. Transportation and discounted lunch available.

### Healthy Alternatives for Little Ones - HALO (National)

Health education curriculum for preschool providers.

### In-Home Services (NE)

Intensive in-home support for families at risk of losing their children. Requires caseworker referral from Northern Service Area.

### Jefferson House (NE)

Safety and guidance for youth. Requires caseworker referral from Northern Service Area.

### Positive Parenting Group (NE)

12-week series of classes for parents of children ages 12 and under. English, Spanish, and Karen languages.

### Ready in 5 (NE)

Academic, social, emotional, and material support to refugee families to help prepare preschoolers for kindergarten.

### Refugee Juvenile Justice Advocate (NE)

Helps refugee youth and parents successfully complete juvenile diversion.

### Ruth K. Solomon Girls Summer Enrichment Program (NE)

Fun summer leadership and arts programming for girls ages 5-18.

### Victim Empathy Program (NE)

Classes and offender mediation.

### Youth Links (NE)

Staff-secure crisis stabilization center for young men ages 10-18. Residential services require referral from Nebraska Families Collaborative, probation, or court.

## COUNSELING & PREVENTION



### Assertive Community Treatment (IA)

Multi-disciplinary support for adults with chronic mental illness.

### Assessment Center (NE)

Walk-in mental health and substance abuse evaluations for adults and youth.

### Better Together (NE)

Intensive outpatient treatment for parents.

### Child & Family Center (IA)

Enhanced therapeutic counseling for children ages birth-18 and their families.

### Employee Assistance Program (IA/NE)

Brief counseling referrals for area business employees.

### Family Works (IA/NE)

Residential substance abuse treatment for pregnant women and mothers with children.

### Heartland Bridges (IA)

Short-term housing for people transitioning to or from mental health or substance abuse treatment, support services, and/or the justice system.

### Integrated Health Home (IA)

Whole health services for Harrison, Mills, and Pottawattamie counties.

### KidSquad (NE)

To help childcare providers identify and resolve child behavior problems.

### Mental Health Counseling (IA/NE)

Professional therapy for individuals, couples, family, and children, including Dialectical Behavioral Therapy (DBT), Seeking Safety, Moral Reconciliation Therapy (MRT), and 24/7 Dad's groups.

### Mental Health Crisis Response Teams (IA/NE)

24/7 assistance to law enforcement on mental health crisis calls. Available in Cass and Sarpy counties in Nebraska and Pottawattamie County in Iowa.

### Mental Health for Youth in Detention (NE)

Crisis intervention for youth at the Douglas County Youth Center and Sarpy Juvenile Justice Center.

### OnTrack of the Heartland (NE)

Innovative team approach to providing recovery-oriented treatment for young people ages 15-25 who have recently begun to experience psychosis.

### Problem Gambling Prevention and Treatment (IA/NE)

Community education and help for problem gamblers and their families. Distance Treatment available in Adair, Cass, Fremont, Harrison, Mills, Montgomery, Page, Pottawattamie, and Shelby counties in Iowa.

### Substance Abuse Evaluations and Treatment (IA/NE)

Outpatient individual treatment and groups for adults and adolescents. OWI and DUI classes also available in English or Spanish.

### Therapeutic School (IA)

Full-day academic and therapeutic programming for K-12 special education students with major mental health diagnoses.

### Victim of Crime Assistance

Assisting victims of crime recover from a traumatic experience.

### Hardship Assistance (NE)

Referral services and brief financial aid. Career Clothing Closet available at the Central Administrative Office and Donation Center at the Sarpy Office.

### Heartland Homes (IA)

Permanent supportive housing for homeless individuals and families with disabilities.

### Homeless Street Outreach (IA/NE)

Case management services to help homeless individuals living on the streets locate permanent housing and address basic needs.

### Permanent Supportive Scattered-Site Housing (IA/NE)

Housing and support services to help individuals who are literally homeless.

### Pottawattamie County Homeless Link (IA)

Short-term financial assistance for individuals at risk of becoming homeless, support services for homeless individuals with severe mental illness, and case management.

### Rapid Rehousing (IA/NE)

Temporary financial assistance (1-12 months) and case management for individuals and families experiencing homelessness.

### Transitions (IA)

Permanent supportive housing for individuals and families who are homeless.

### Ways to Work (IA/NE)

Low-interest auto loans for eligible parents in five counties in Iowa and Nebraska.
